“ Great Aunt Marian! What a remarkable woman she was. Growing up in northern Wisconsin, far from the hub of the family-life in the Chicago area, Aunt Marian always made my brother and I feel welcome and loved when we came to visit for weddings and Christmas parties. I know she felt great warmth toward my father, her nephew who was just 11 years younger than her, and she generously extended that warmth to us. She believed in family. As she did for so many, she always sent a card for every birthday (I was still getting them long into adulthood!) When my grandmother, Marge, her older sister, was diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease, she was there for us. When I became my grandma's caregiver at the ripe old age of 24, she was a constant support for me and picked up the slack when I became overwhelmed or needed a break, which was often. She tirelessly visited her in the nursing home and kept on the staff about her care. Our gratitude for her unwavering dedication to her sister has no limits. Some time after my grandma was moved to Wisconsin to be closer to my dad, Marian and I went on a road trip to northern Wisconsin for a visit. During the 16 total hours of driving, she shared with me her memories and stories of growing up, the hard times she endured and overcame, and the life she built, along with a lot of wisdom about the world. She, (and my grandmother, too) was an example of loving generosity, perseverance, loyalty, and grit. She is the last of her generation. I'm so glad I knew her. I'm so sorry she is gone.
